Message from the Board

The Year 2019 has been challenging. By the close of the year, the outbreak of Corona virus in Wuhan, China alerted the world to the dangers of not respecting biological boundaries and increasing interaction of human species with the wild. The outbreak, which looked like a localized one spread faster than a wildfire and within two months it was declared a pandemic. From China, it spread immediately to the Europe and then America. By March it also invaded Asia, Africa and Latin America. India initially did better than many countries in protecting its citizens against the Covid 19 pandemic, however, it seems to be going out of hands in India too. By March almost half of the population of the world remained lock to prevent the spread, with huge economic consequences. IMF predicts that the economic fall out of the pandemic is going to be worse than the great depression of the 1930s.

PAIRVI continued to work with unstinted zeal to protect and promote human rights and advocate and encourage sustainability through better actions on climate change and sustainable development goals. It acts at various levels from local, to sub national to national. It has also making initial footprint in the sub regional (south Asia) and regional (Asia and the Pacific) space. It has followed and tried to contribute assiduously at global spaces too especially UN processes related to climate change and sustainable development goals. However, despite working at several fora on variety of platforms, protection of human rights at local level, working with most marginalized and vulnerable and enhancing access to justice remains at the heart of PAIRVI. This year, we also added an opportunity to engage with tribal marginal farmers in 5 states on enhancing their food and nutritional security as well as promoting pulse biodiversity in collaboration with ITPGR and FAO. We are hopeful that this small effort will bring long term implications for the lives of these indigenous peoples. We are also hopeful that the recommendations from the programme review will also lead us to new frontiers and enable us to make new inroads in our struggle for the poor and the underserved.

We hope that you will find this brief report interesting and we can be assured of your continued support. While we are saddened to see the loss of precious lives and miseries of millions of people including the poorest who are worst affected, we sincerely hope that we will come out of this pandemic stronger and wiser.

Overview

PAIRVI continued to work with two broad objectives of protection and promotion of human rights and sustainability. While its human rights programme aims at capacity building of grassroots organizations and community based organizations on human rights. Rights advocacy and monitoring looks at strengthening human rights infrastructure and demand improving life situations of the most marginalized communities. In order to engage in evidence based advocacy, PAIRVI also produces an impressive number of research, publications, policy briefs and reports. The sustainability programmes underpins the human rights based approach to development and advocates factoring in ecological protection in development approaches and programmes. It has been engaging in sub national, national and also global processes related to climate change, sustainable development goals and environment conservation. This year also PAIRVI engaged with wide variety of communities in improving sustainability policies and practices, at multiple platforms.



Human rights programme

Human rights programme organized a number of activities around the themes of strengthening human rights infrastructure, enhancing access to justice, promoting social security and alternative livelihoods, and working with most marginalized populations.

Working with most marginalized populations

PAIRVI also continued to work with many most marginalized and vulnerable communities including Women Beedi Workers and Paharia PVTGs. Women Beedi workers in Bihar and Paharias in Jharkhand were engaged in a number of activities to link them with legal aid, social security and alternative livelihoods. More than 200 women beedi workers and Paharias were linked to government social security programmes through a variety of ways including getting them PDS, MGNREGA, Labour cards, getting them finally included, and taking their several complaints related to the deficiency in government services to the relevant officials for resolution. It also brought out a study on the poor plight of families displaced several times over in Madanmahal, Jabalpur in Madhya Pradesh.

Strengthening human rights infrastructure

A number of state consultations were organized in States of Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh to study and demand improvement in the prison conditions in these states. The studies found deplorable situation of prisons with appalling congestion, poor food, extremely worrying sanitation and health facilities, noncompliance of jail manuals, inappropriate treatment to inmates etc.



Enhancing access to justice

PAIRVI organized a number of case consultations and legal aid camps to provide legal aid to people. More than 200 persons including Paharias PVTGs, Tharus, Women Beedi workers, Children in conflict with law were provided legal aid in these camps. A number of consultations also looked into the functioning of the state and the district legal aid services authority and found it awfully inadequate. PAIRVI has also created a network of pro bono activists and lawyers to provide legal aid to the most needy and victims of human rights violations.



Rights of Children

PAIRVI intervened in deaths of large number of children due to the AES in Bihar, by conducting a fact finding and sharing its findings with local media, relevant duty bearers and CSOs. It also provided legal aid to children in conflict with law in states of Bihar and Jharkhand and also conducted visits of shelter homes. A workshop for adolescent girls was also organized in collaboration with PANI in Faizabad, Uttar Pradesh.



Capacity building of the CSOs and the Human Rights Defenders

As a part of its central mandate PAIRVI has engaged with hundreds of grassroots organizations, HRDs and community based organizations on enhancing their understanding on human rights and improving their skills for accessing justice. Workshops and consultations addressed over a hundred of CSOs. A four day comprehensive National Workshop provided more than 40 hours training to 35 CSOs, HRDs, Advocates, media persons on variety of issues related to human rights (both civil and political rights and economic, social and cultural rights) protection and promotion.





Sustainability programme

PAIRVI engages in a variety of activities to improve policies and policies related to sustainability which includes climate change, energy, sustainable food systems, sustainable development goals. It also participates in a number of processes related to these concerns including the UN Meetings. These activities are organized under the banner of MAUSAM (Movement for Advancing Understanding on Sustainability and Mutuality), which a pan India collective of organizations (CSOs) working on variety of issues with sustainability concerns.

National Consultation with Farmers (LNOB Consultation series)

A National Consultation with farmers was organized as a part of "Leave No One Behind" Consultations towards the preparation of India's Voluntary National Report 2020 (VNR 2020), to be presented in the UN's High Level Political Forum (HLPF) in July 2020. The Consultation witnessed participation of more than 200 farmers and all major national farmers' organizations. It looked at farmers as social groups and delved deep into challenges and vulnerabilities of often-left-behind farmers, i.e., rainfed farmers, women farmers, tenant farmers, landless farmers, livestock farmers / pastoralists and adivasi farmers and came up with actionable suggestions and recommendations. This Consultation was organized in collaboration with CECOEDECON and WNTA.



COP 25

A delegation of PAIRVI participated in COP 25 at Madrid Spain. They engaged in a number of activities including side events, press conferences, solidarity activities, meeting with country delegations, following negotiations on different tracks. Ajay K Jha spoke on a side event organized by Ibon Foundation and others on 11th December, titled "Climate Justice Town Hall: People-Powered Climate Action: Reclaiming the Climate Agenda amid Corporate Plunder and Repression." He spoke on how UNFCCC has failed to make any progress since its beginning and there is not much hope if world is trapped in negotiating a failure every year. Before, COP, a PRECOP Consultation organized in Delhi witnessed participation of NGOs, Academics, media and representatives of the Chilean Embassy in Delhi. PAIRVI has been following, participating and contributing in UNFCCC COP since Copenhagen COP.



High Level Political Forum on SDGs

PAIRVI also participated in a number of activities at the HLPF held in New York during mid July. HLPF is the central UN body for review of progress on the SDGs. PAIRVI was invited to speak at the side event organized by APRCEM in collaboration with ESCAP titled "Reviewing and Strengthening Regional Processes; Missing Link from Regional to Global." It also participated in a meeting with ESCAP Executive Secretary organized by ESCAP and spoke on HLPF Reforms in the regional context. During a simultaneously held Groud Level Peoples Forum on 14th July, Ajay Jha gave a key note speech in the workshop on "Means of Implementation to reduce Inequality."

Participation in Regional Processes

PAIRVI participates in the UN processes organized by the Regional Commission ESCAP. In 2020 all the events were organized virtually and PAIRVI participated in a number of events including pre APFSD Meetings (March April 2020). It also participated in a number of discussions and consultations organized on Covid in south Asia, and consultations of countries presenting VNR in HLPF 2020 (India, Bangladesh and Nepal).



Monitoring sub national and national programmes and policies

PAIRVI engages with variety of actors and communities in order to create support groups for monitoring state and national programmes and policies. a number of workshops, consultations, symposiums, discussion and dialogues are organized or facilitated by PAIRVI for this purpose. During this period PAIRVI facilitated workshops with IIT Delhi, SOIR IM (Dehradun), Offer (Delhi), NIRDPR (Hyderabad), Wateraid India (Delhi), Wada Na Todo (Delhi), SIT (Delhi), and SADED (Delhi). These activities primarily discussed sub national, national and global policies and practices on climate change, sustainable development, political economy of sustainability, avenues of intervention in global and regional processes, and how CSOs can improve implementation and monitoring, and monitoring of these policies.
